

Caveats for 2015 Year 12 results

These caveats reflect differences in rules and definitions for reporting on senior secondary certificates in the various states and territories. More detailed information is available on the <u>Australasian Curriculum</u>, <u>Assessment and Certification Authorities (ACACA)</u> website.

Senior secondary measures	
Senior secondary certificate awarded	The number of students for each school who left at the end of 2015 having fulfilled the requirements for a senior secondary certificate issued by a Board of Studies in the relevant state or territory.
Completed senior secondary school	The number of students for each school who left at the end 2015 having completed the equivalent of two or more years post Year 10 studies (not necessarily full-time nor consecutive) who are eligible for a statement of results, or a record of achievements.

New South Wales ¹	
Senior secondary certificate awarded	Students awarded the NSW Higher School Certificate in the specified year and who did not have an enrolment the following year at the same school.
Completed senior secondary school	Students awarded the NSW Higher School Certificate or the Record of School Achievement identifying completion of at least one HSC course, and who did not have an enrolment the following year.

Victoria	
Senior secondary certificate awarded	For Victorian schools, these are students who have satisfactorily completed an accredited senior secondary qualification and who did not have an enrolment in the following year. An accredited qualification in
Completed senior secondary school	Victoria is either: Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE), and/or Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL) at the intermediate and/or senior level(s). Note: Includes full-fee-paying students from overseas.



Queensland ²	
Senior secondary certificate awarded	 represents total Year 12 students awarded a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) at the end of Year 12. The QCE is Queensland's senior school qualification, which is awarded to eligible students, usually at the end of Year 12. It recognises broad learning options and offers flexibility in what, where and when learning occurs. includes international, fee-paying and visa students.
Completed senior secondary school	 represents total Year 12 students that satisfied the completion requirements for Year 12 in Queensland and were issued with a Senior Statement at the end of Year 12. The Senior Statement is a transcript of the learning account for all students completing Year 12 at a Queensland school. It shows all studies and the results achieved that may contribute to the award of a QCE or Tertiary Entrance Statement. includes international, fee-paying and visa students.

South Australia ¹	
Senior secondary certificate awarded	This measure includes those students who were enrolled in 2015. These students may or may not have returned to study in the following year.
Completed senior secondary school	This measure includes those students who were enrolled in 2015 but not in 2016. These students did not undertake any further South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) study in 2016.

Western Australia ²	
Senior secondary certificate awarded	The measure represents the number of Year 12 students who left school at the end of 2015 and who had completed the requirements of the Western Australian Certificate of Education. It does not include international, full fee-paying or mature aged students.
Completed senior secondary school	The measure represents the number of full time Year 12 students who left school at the end of 2015, completed two years of study post year 10 and who received a final statement of results. It does not include international, full fee-paying or mature aged students.



Tasmania ¹	
Senior secondary certificate awarded	The number of Year 12/13 students in 2015, who were aged 15-19 and an Australian citizen, having met the standards required for the award of the Tasmanian Certificate of Education.
Completed senior secondary school	The number of Year 12/13 students in 2015, who were aged 15-19 and an Australian citizen, having received a formal statement showing one or more results in senior secondary courses and/or VET.

Northern Territory ²	
Senior secondary certificate awarded	Is defined as a student that had an enrolment in the specified year and had met the completion requirements to gain the Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET) in the specified year.
Completed senior secondary school	These students had an enrolment in the specified year and may have obtained a Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET) in the specified year. These students did not undertake any further NTCET study in the following year.

Australian Capital Territory	
Senior secondary certificate awarded	Incorporates all students who received an ACT Senior Secondary Certificate at the end of the year.
Completed senior secondary school	Includes students who received an ACT Senior Secondary Certificate and those who were undertaking Year 12 studies at the end of the year but did not meet the requirements for a Senior Secondary Certificate.
