

## Caveats for 2016 Year 12 results

These caveats reflect differences in rules and definitions for reporting on senior secondary certificates in the various states and territories. More detailed information is available on the [Australasian Curriculum, Assessment and Certification Authorities \(ACACA\)](#) website.

Senior secondary measures	
<b>Senior secondary certificate awarded</b>	The number of students for each school who left at the end of 2016 having fulfilled the requirements for a senior secondary certificate issued by a Board of Studies in the relevant state or territory.
<b>Completed senior secondary school</b>	The number of students for each school who left at the end 2016 having completed the equivalent of two or more years post Year 10 studies (not necessarily full-time nor consecutive) who are eligible for a statement of results, or a record of achievements.

New South Wales <sup>1</sup>	
<b>Senior secondary certificate awarded</b>	Students awarded the NSW Higher School Certificate in the specified year and who did not have an enrolment the following year.
<b>Completed senior secondary school</b>	Students awarded the NSW Higher School Certificate or the Record of School Achievement identifying completion of at least one HSC course, and who did not have an enrolment the following year.

Victoria	
<b>Senior secondary certificate awarded</b>	For Victorian schools, these are students who have satisfactorily completed an accredited senior secondary qualification and who did not have an enrolment in the following year. An accredited qualification in Victoria is either: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE), and/or</li> <li>• Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL) at the intermediate and/or senior level(s).</li> </ul> Note: Includes full-fee-paying students from overseas.
<b>Completed senior secondary school</b>	

Queensland <sup>2</sup>	
<b>Senior secondary certificate awarded</b>	<p>This count:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>represents total Year 12 students awarded a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) at the end of Year 12. The QCE is Queensland's senior school qualification, which is awarded to eligible students, usually at the end of Year 12. It recognises broad learning options and offers flexibility in what, where and when learning occurs.</li> <li>includes international, fee-paying and visa students.</li> </ul>
<b>Completed senior secondary school</b>	<p>This count:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>represents total Year 12 students that satisfied the completion requirements for Year 12 in Queensland and were issued with a Senior Statement at the end of Year 12. The Senior Statement is a transcript of the learning account for all students completing Year 12 at a Queensland school. It shows all studies and the results achieved that may contribute to the award of a QCE or Tertiary Entrance Statement.</li> <li>includes international, fee-paying and visa students.</li> </ul>

South Australia <sup>1</sup>	
<b>Senior secondary certificate awarded</b>	<p>This measure includes those students who were enrolled in 2016. These students may or may not have returned to study in the following year.</p>
<b>Completed senior secondary school</b>	<p>This measure includes those students who were enrolled in 2016 but not in 2017. These students did not undertake any further South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) study in 2017.</p>

Western Australia <sup>2</sup>	
<b>Senior secondary certificate awarded</b>	<p>The measure represents the number of Year 12 students who left school at the end of 2016 and who had completed the requirements of the Western Australian Certificate of Education. It does not include international, full fee-paying or mature aged students.</p>
<b>Completed senior secondary school</b>	<p>The measure represents the number of full time Year 12 students who left school at the end of 2016, completed two years of study post year 10 and who received a final statement of results. It does not include international, full fee-paying or mature aged students.</p>

Tasmania	
<b>Senior secondary certificate awarded</b>	The number of Year 12/13 students in 2016, who were aged 15-19 and an Australian citizen, having met the standards required for the award of the Tasmanian Certificate of Education.
<b>Completed senior secondary school</b>	The number of Year 12/13 students in 2016, who were aged 15-19 and an Australian citizen, having received a formal statement showing one or more results in senior secondary courses and/or VET.

Northern Territory <sup>2</sup>	
<b>Senior secondary certificate awarded</b>	Is defined as a student that had an enrolment in the specified year and had met the completion requirements to gain the Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET).
<b>Completed senior secondary school</b>	This measure includes those students who had an enrolment in the specified year but no enrolment in the following year. These students did not undertake any further Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET) study in the following year.

Australian Capital Territory	
<b>Senior secondary certificate awarded</b>	Incorporates all students who received an ACT Senior Secondary Certificate at the end of the year.
<b>Completed senior secondary school</b>	Includes students who received an ACT Senior Secondary Certificate and those who were undertaking Year 12 studies at the end of the year but did not meet the requirements for a Senior Secondary Certificate.
